FAITH FORMATION

Holy Trinity has a very active Campus Ministry with opportunities for all students to get involved. There are in-house retreats for each grade-level as well as out-of-state mission trips. ACADEMIC FLEXIBILITY

Holy Trinity takes a holistic approach to creating students' schedules by assessing their skills in each subject area. This allows students to take all Regents, all Honors/AP, or a mixed schedule. Students can also change those designations year-to-year, allowing them the freedom to challenge themselves in order to strive for higher academic levels throughout high school.

TECHNOLOGY

Holy Trinity utilizes Google Classroom technology to enhance the academic experience for students, parents, and faculty members. Our 1:1 Chrombook initiative allows for all students to utilize technology both in the classroom as well as for homework assignments.

GUIDANCE DEPARTMENT & SUPPORT STAFF

Holy Trinity employs full-time, New York State certified school counselors. Our four-year Guidance curriculum incorporates both group and individual meetings with our counselors starting in freshman year. Holy Trinity does accept IEP/504 documentation and students can receive academic accommodations.

STEM

Our STEM elective classes consist of project-based learning and design thinking. Students write research papers and participate in STEM fairs across Long Island. The coding languages, Alice, Javascript, Python and HTML/CSS are taught as well as MIT App Inventor. Field trips to college and university labs, as well as speakers from various STEM fields are also part of the courses.

COLLEGE COURSES

College courses are offered in conjunction with St. John's University and Molloy College. These are regular freshman-level courses, which are listed in the university catalogue. Each course is a one-semester offering and earns 3 college credits.

ATHLETICS

Holy Trinity offers 17 interscholastic athletic programs. Over 70% of our students participate in at least one sport throughout the school year. Holy Trinity's coaches share a deep commitment to faithful practice and development of student-athletes. Our coaches also possess a wealth of collegiate experience and are proud that 100+ Titans are currently playing at the NCAA level.

PERFORMING ARTS

Holy Trinity is the only Catholic high school on Long Island that offers a NYS-approved Performing Arts curriculum. Students in the Performing Arts curriculum concentrate in areas of Theatre, Dance, Choir, Band, or Orchestra. Holy Trinity currently offers 14 Performing Arts courses as well as 12 productions and afterschool programs.

VISUAL ARTS

Holy Trinity offers more Visual Arts electives than any other Catholic high school on Long Island, which allows our students to explore many areas of artistic expression. Some examples of Visual Arts electives are Mechanical Drawing, Fashion Illustration and Design, Basic Architectural Design, and Digital Art & Animation.
