

TOP TEN FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

1. Does Holy Trinity follow the New York State Education Department Graduation requirements?

Yes. Holy Trinity is chartered by the NYS Education Department and all students must meet the NYS Education criteria for graduation along with Holy Trinity's additional academic requirements. Holy Trinity's graduation requirements are much more rigorous than the NYS requirement.

2. Are your teachers New York State Certified?

Yes. Holy Trinity teachers are required to have NYS Certification in their subject area where NYS Certification is available. They are also required to maintain their certification by completing all required professional development required for their license. 95% of Holy Trinity's teachers hold a Masters Degree or higher.

3. Can students earn college credit while attending Holy Trinity?

Yes. Holy Trinity offers 9 college courses affiliated with St. John's University, Molloy College and LIU on the Holy Trinity campus. Enrolled students who fulfill the course requirements receive an official transcript from the college or university that may be submitted to many colleges for transfer credit.

4. Does Holy Trinity offer Advanced Placement courses?

Yes. Holy Trinity offers 9 Advanced Placement courses that have been authorized by the College Board. Enrollment in these courses can enhance a student's eligibility for college admission, allow them to earn college credit, or place them in higher-level college courses.

5. What is Holy Trinity's average class size?

Holy Trinity's average class size is 28. Holy Trinity has 70 teachers on staff with a student ratio of 1 to 16.

6. How will Holy Trinity assist my family in the reinforcement of Catholic doctrine and the growth of our student's faith life?

As a component of Trinity's rigorous academic requirements, our students are required to be enrolled in a Religion class each semester. The students explore the Catholic faith and encourage a personal response to God through the spirit of Jesus. Trinity also has a Campus Ministry program that provides students with an opportunity to grow as a Catholic faith community through prayer, service and retreat activities.

7. How will I be notified of my student's progress at Holy Trinity?

Families will receive quarterly report cards and four interim progress reports. Parents also have the opportunity to meet their student's teachers on parent-teacher nights. Homework can be found on the Holy Trinity e-Chalk website and our teachers are available by phone or email.

8. Are there athletic and extra-curricular activities available for my student at Holy Trinity?

Holy Trinity offers 19 interscholastic sports. The sports may have Freshmen, Junior Varsity and Varsity levels. Trinity also offers over 40 extracurricular clubs. We believe that there is a club or sport of interest for every student at Trinity.

9. How is transportation to Holy Trinity provided?

Trinity students reside in multiple school districts and the student's district of residence provides transportation. Most of the school districts also provide late bus transportation to their students who remain for after-school activities. Please contact your public school district for transportation details.

10. Is there financial aid available at Holy Trinity?

The tuition charged by Holy Trinity does not cover the cost of educating a student at Holy Trinity. The Diocese of Rockville Centre supplements the full cost of educating each student.
